<p>Recycled Art Find objects around the house (junk mail, wood scraps, random toys or old food containers and create a collage or sculpture <i>*photo of your work or the actual artwork</i></p>	<p>Fashion Art Decorate a t-shirt or sew a piece of clothing or create your own new fashion design with a drawing <i>*photo of your work or the actual artwork</i></p>	<p>Coloring Book Make your OWN coloring book style outline art and then let someone else color it <i>*photo of the work or the actual artwork</i></p>	<p>Rock Painting Find the perfect rock outside and decorate it with paints or some other art medium (for example: crayon, colored pencil, oil pastel) <i>*photo of your work or the actual artwork</i></p>	<p>Treasure Map Hide something and draw a map with an X for the treasure.
